4 ***The Changing Slums***

5 “Slum” is a word meaning an area of a city with low-quality housing that often
 lacks basic services, such as electricity and clean water. In developing countries,
 slums are created when large numbers of poor people move to cities in search of
 work. According to the United Nations (UN), about one in seven people in the
 world live in slums.

6 City officials usually consider slums a problem, and the solution has been to try
 to get rid of them. Now, the UN is asking cities to (24). That is, they want
 cities to improve slums and make them part of the city, rather than destroy
 them.
